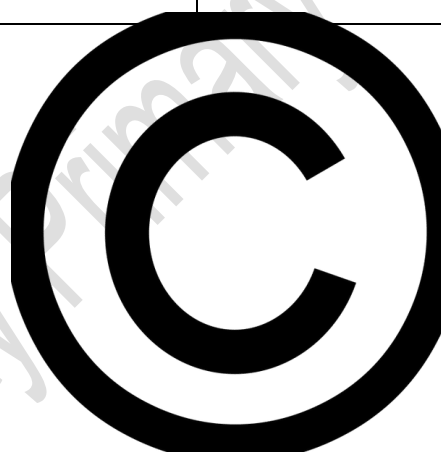
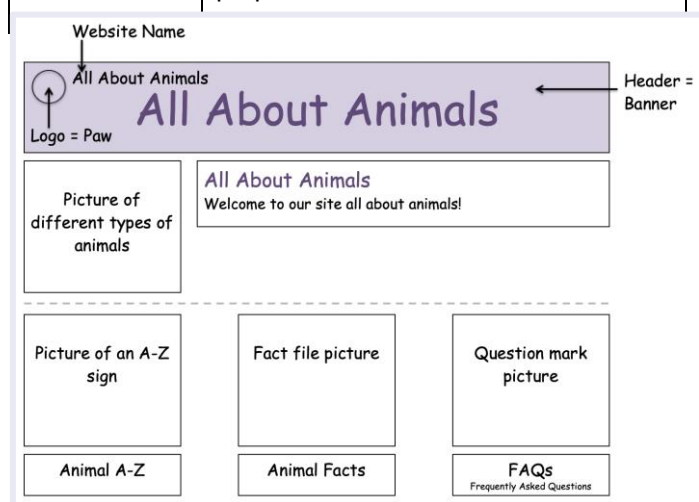

webpage	A hypertext document on the world wide web (WWW)	navigation	How content can be accessed within a website
website	A collection of webpages which are collated together and can be found using a uniform reference locator.	content	Information contained on a webpage or within a website.
HTML	Hypertext Markup Language is the code used to build the website	hyperlink	A digital navigation tool to access another website/webpage by clicking on a word/phrase/picture
copyright	The legal right for the owner to distribute, use and adapt original content	domain	A website's name- often found in the URL.
fair use	Using copyrighted material without the owners permission for certain, limited purposes.		



Key Knowledge

- Each website has a unique, Uniform Reference Locator (URL)- otherwise known as a **domain**, which helps provide an address in order to find and locate a website on the World Wide Web (WWW).
- Each website is made up of **Hypertext Markup Language (HTML)** which provides the code and instructions to build the website and its content.
- Information which can be found within a website is called **content** and can take many forms e.g. writing, pictures, videos.
- You can **navigate** a website through the use of **links, hyperlinks and webpage** menus.
- **Copyrighted** material (©) should only be used with the explicit agreement or consent of the original owner.
- Some material can be used without the original owner's permission, but only under certain circumstances e.g. research, teaching, news reporting under a **fair use policy**.
