

## Art Subject Knowledge Bank Year 2: Printing-Mimic Patterns in the Environment

<u>Vocabulary</u>	<u>Definition</u>
<b>Printing</b>	A method of making a copy of an image usually using paint.
<b>Printing Ink</b>	A thick sticky ink which makes a clear copy of a raised shape or pattern.
<b>Mimic</b>	To copy or imitate something.
<b>Repeat</b>	To do the same thing over and over again.
<b>Pattern</b>	A design in which lines, shapes, forms or colours are repeated.
<b>Roller</b>	Tool used to apply paint to a surface.
<b>Environment</b>	An environment is everything that surrounds us e.g. school environment, cold environment, home environment.
<b>Evaluate</b>	To decide what has worked well and if there is anything you may wish to change.

### How to print

Squeeze a line of printing ink onto a flat tray.  
Carefully roll out the ink to cover the roller with a thin coating of ink.  
Roll the ink onto the surface to be printed.  
Place the paper on a soft surface like foam to get the best quality of print.  
Place the object onto the paper with even pressure.  
Remove the object carefully to see the result.

A print is an impression made by any method involving transfer from one surface to another.
