# How have toys changed?


- Toys have changed over time. ٠ Some have changed significantly while others barely at all.
- Toys are made of different ٠ materials. The material(s) a toy is made from can help us to know how old the toy is.

### Rich children and poor children

- Older toys are usually made from wood, metal and paper. Most were handmade.
- Children from rich families played with rocking horses and dolls ٠ that were made out of expensive materials.
- Children from poorer families played with toys that were usually ٠ homemade.
- Children who lived during the First and Second World Wars • enjoyed playing outside.
- Some toys, like teddies, have hardly changed over time.

## What about modern toys?

- Modern toys are usually made from plastic and fabric and are produced in factories.
- Technological advances have made modern toys more interactive e.g. talking toys, consoles, tablets. This has affected the ways in which children play.
- Modern toys are much safer than toys from the past as they have to pass toy safety tests.
- between old and new toys this can be down to how they move and what they are made from.
