opinion	A view or judgement formed about something
stakeholder	A person with an interest or concern about something
conclusion	A decision reached by reasoning
proposal	A plan or suggestion
debate	A formal discussion on a particular topic
hypothesis	A proposed explanation that requires further investigation

How are decisions made about proposed changes?

- Make a hypothesis.
- Decide on data gathering.
- Gather data. Present as a graph
- Look at results.
- Draw conclusions and make proposals based on them.


How are future changes planned for?

- Draw a map with the proposed changes.
- Ensure correct key and 6 figure grid reference is used.
- Why have they chosen what they have?
- What are all stakeholders, age ranges of population going to think about them?



How can the impact of any potential change be measured?

- Find out disadvantages.
- Find out advantages.
- Why might people have different opinions.
- Consider different stakeholders
- Debate the case.



What is a survey?

- Surveys help to find out opinions on a particular topic.
- Consider age range of people surveyed why might that make a difference?
- Once decided on the questions that will be asked survey needs need to be completed through fieldwork to gather answers.

How do you use the results of a survey?

- Look at results to answer questions about what people like/dislike about Selby.
- Draw conclusions that could help form plans about how Selby will look in the future based on evidence from the survey.
